Was a hazard assessment performed to establish either a procedure or plan, depending on the situation?				
Is there a fall-protection safe work procedure for heights less than 7.5 m when the people are not protected by a permanent guardrail, and not working from a scaffold or elevated work platform?				
Is there a fall protection plan established for work above 7.5 m where the people are not protected by a permanent guardrail or working from a scaffold or elevated work platform?				
Was everyone appropriately trained?

Are guardrails correctly designed and installed?				
Is temporary flooring able to withstand 4 times the maximum load to be on it; installed to extend over the entire work area; and securely fastened to prevent lateral or upward movement?

Are all equipment and connecting components for fall protection used and maintained according to the applicable standard and regulations?
